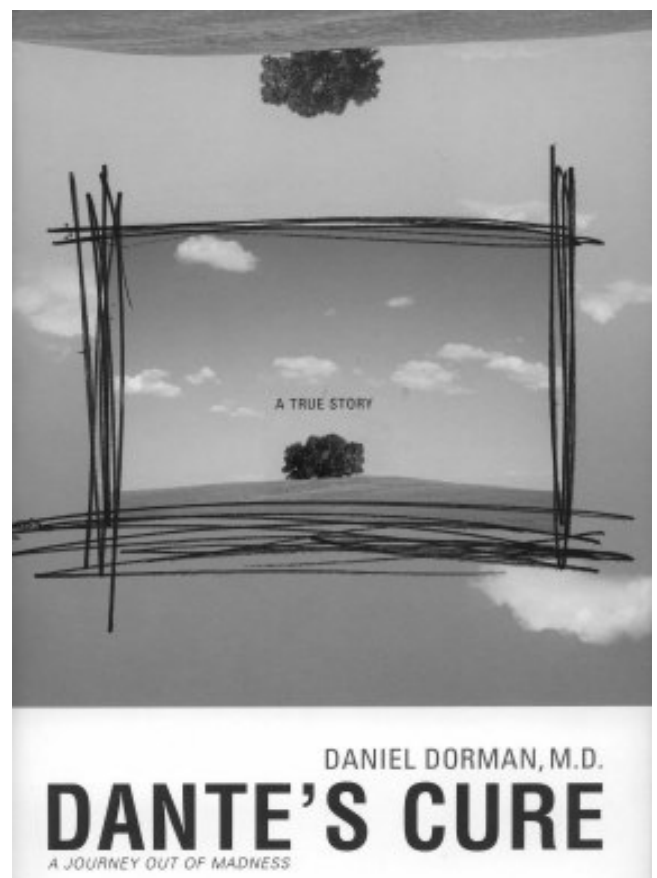

Psychotherapy and Schizophrenia Should Listening Replace Drugs?

For years, Catherine Penney was in extreme anguish, hospitalized and diagnosed as a chronic schizophrenic. While some patients feel medications are effective, for Catherine psychotherapy without any medication led to complete recovery. She now works as a nurse and patients' advocate. Despite successes like Catherine's, most patients are offered no psychotherapy, are put on powerful drugs that sometimes cause worse illness, and are treated as if they will never recover.
